Some spectator rules

- Overnight camping is permitted only on the night before the parade. Do not arrive before noon
- All people and property (blankets, chairs, etc.) must remain on the curb until 11 p.m. Sunday, when spectators may move out to the blue
- No public areas (sidewalks, curbs, etc.) may be cordoned or roped off.
- No tents, sofas, ladders, scaffolding or boxes.
- No bonfires.

Parking

Paid meter parking is offered in numerous lots on a first come, first served basis. Reserved parade parking for automobiles, buses and recreational vehicles is available through Sharp Seating Co. (626) 795-4171, the city of Pasadena Parking Division (626) 744-6470 and Easy Parking Service (626) 286-7576.

Limited RV parking is available next to the Rose Bowl at Brookside Park between noon Sunday and noon Thursday, weather permitting.

Public transporation

Metro Rail Gold Line stations at Memorial Park. Lake, Allen and Del Mar are all within a short walk of the parade route. The Metropolitan Transportation Authority will provide regular bus service to areas near the parade. For more information, call 1-800-COMMUTE or visit mta.net.

Post-parade float viewing

Rose Parade floats will be on display for public viewing along Sierra Madre Blvd. between Paloma St. and Sierra Madre Villa Ave., and along Washington Blvd. between Sierra Madre Blvd. and Woodlyn Road. Hours are Monday from 1 to 4 p.m. and Tuesday from 7 to 9 a.m. for the disabled and senior citizens. 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for everyone. Admission is \$7. Children 5 and younger are free.
