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The following interview of NIKOLAS CRUZ is transcribed from a video file labeled CID Room 1 - Camera B, dated 2018-02-14. Time stamp on the recording begins at 18:09:56.

This interview is being conducted by **Detective**John Curcio of the Broward County Sheriff's Office.

(Nikolas Cruz enters interview room at 18:16:15.)

DEPUTY GEIGER: Go in there and have a seat in that far chair. All right? Pull your pants up a little bit. Have a seat. Spread your feet out. Don't -- don't -- do not think about getting up. All right, buddy?

(Deputies exited the interview room at 18:17:24.)

(Detective Curcio entered the interview room at 18:20:10.)

DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. How you doing, Nick? You all right? You got to be able to speak so I can hear you.

All right. I just need to ask you really your name and date of birth just to confirm I got it right and I'm going to see if you want a glass of water or something. What's your first

1	name? Come on, Nick. Huh?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Nikolas.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Spell it for me.
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: N-I-K
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Come on. I'm old. You
6	got to talk so I can hear you. N-I-K
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: O-L-A-S.
8	DETECTIVE CURCIO: O.
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: L.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay.
11	NIKOLAS CRUZ: A-S.
12	DETECTIVE CURCIO: A-S. And what's your
13	middle name?
14	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Jacob.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Come on, man, speak so
16	I can hear you.
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Jacob.
18	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Jacob. J-A-C-O-B?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What's your last name?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Cruz.
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Cruz. Okay. Again,
23	man, unless you want me to sit in your lap
24	because you're talking so quietly, you're going
25	to have to speak so I can hear you. Let's get a

little closer to the table so me and you can 1 2 communicate. 3 What's your date of birth? Okay. You need to relax because I'm --5 I'm the last detective or policeman you're going to have to talk to. So right off the bat, that 6 7 should be somewhat comforting to you to know that I'm the last guy you got to talk to. 8 But the thing about it is -- look at me. I got to be able to hear you. Okay? So all I 10 want to do is get basic information from you and 11 12 then we'll get into the, you know, whether you 13 want a glass of water, all that stuff. 14 Nothing -- nothing I'm gonna do is going to be 15 confusing. I just need to get your date of 16 birth off the top of my head. 17 What's your date of birth? 18 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Zero nine. 19 DETECTIVE CURCIO: January? 20 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Zero nine. 21 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Zero nine. September. 22 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Twenty-four. 23 DETECTIVE CURCIO: What is it? 24 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Twenty-four.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Twenty-four.

1	NIKOLAS CRUZ: '98.
2	DETECTIVE CURCIO: '98. How old does that
3	make you?
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Nineteen.
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Nineteen. Okay. All
6	right. Let me do this. You want you want a
7	cold water?
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't know.
9	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You don't know if you
10	want a cold water? It was hot out there. I
11	know I want to get a cold water. So if I come
12	back with a cold water
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't deserve it.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Whether you deserve it
15	or not, do you want a cold water?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, thank you.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No, thank you. I'm
18	going to bring in two because I want one. It
19	was it was hot and if you decide you want to
20	have it, that's fine. But, you know, again, I
21	want you to understand, you know, I'm the last
22	guy you're going to have to talk to.
23	You know, what's happened has happened.
24	But now me and you, we've got to kind of
25	communicate so I can hear you. And, and again

1	I'm going to ask you, you know, things about
2	background and, you know, things about what
3	happened.
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Okay.
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay? But you're
6	not you got to relax and, you know, I'll
7	bring you in some water. Are you sure you don't
8	want something to eat?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
10	negative.)
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Nineteen years
12	old. Where were you born? What city?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't know.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You don't know. Do you
15	know what state?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Florida.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Florida. Have you
18	lived down here your whole life?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But you don't
21	know what city? Do you know what hospital?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
23	negative.)
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. All right. So
25	you were definitely born in Florida. Okay. Let

1	me go get those waters and I'll be right back.
2	Okay?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
4	affirmative.)
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Of course I've got so
6	many different keys. All right. I'll be right
7	back.
8	(Detective Curcio exited the interview
9	room at 18:23:54.)
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Kill me. Just fucking kill
11	me. Fuck.
12	(Detective Curcio entered the interview
13	room at 18:26:33.)
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. If they're
15	not bleeding any more and you want them off, we
16	can pull them off. I'll get you a garbage can.
17	You want them off? Just put them on the ground.
18	Throw them on the floor in the corner.
19	All right. This one is mine because I
20	already opened it. This one is yours in case
21	you change your mind. All right?
22	All right. Again, I got to be able to
23	hear you. I understand a little bit. People
24	told me some of your a little bit about your
2.5	background but I don't know if any of it's true

1 or not. Where -- what --2 (Phone ringing.) First off, let me put my phone on --3 (On the phone) Okay. I'm in the room at 4 5 the moment so -- okay. I'm going off the phone 6 completely so I'm turning it off. No. When you get down here, Walt -- Walt's down here. He can 7 8 tell you everything that's going on. Bye. (End 9 of phone call). 10 All right. Okay. You know, again, some 11 people have given me some background about you. 12 I don't know if any of it's true or not. The 13 address where you were staying at recently, do you know the house number and everything? 14 NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the 15 16 negative.) DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Do you know what 17 city it was in? 18 19 NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the 20 negative). DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. Let me sit 21 22 closer because I can tell I'm going to have a 23 hard time hearing you. All right. 24 Are you staying with a family member or a 25 friend? Come on. You got to relax, man.

Because the questions I'm asking you right now are just your background questions. Okay?

You know, I understand what we're going to talk about is going to be difficult. I understand that certain things are going to be hard for you to explain to me, but you're the only one who can explain these things to me.

Okay? All right? So I'm going to ask you some background stuff. It's real simple.

You know, do you know what city you were living in the last, say, week or -- how long have you been living with your friend?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Four months.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Four months. Okay. I got to take notes because I'm old. What's your friend's name?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: I can't remember.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: You can't remember?
You know him from where?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: School.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. And the school you know him from -- again, some of these questions are going to sound stupid, but I need to know. What school do you know him from? From Douglas?

21	I forgot to do it. All right.
22	Is he okay? From what I understand, he's
23	okay. But again, I I got to get a little
2 4	background information like where you're
25	staying, your phone number. You know, some of

1	the things I'm hearing out there, I need to know
2	if it's true or not. Okay? So what what
3	name do you call him by?
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Brother.
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Brother? Okay. And is
6	that you've been staying there four months.
7	Is that where you stayed last night, at his
8	house?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I can't remember.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You can't remember.
11	Okay.
12	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I can't remember anything.
13	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Well, I think
14	you can remember, but we'll get into that as we
15	get into
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I'll try.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. I mean, you
18	know, as we get into this. What about your
19	phone, do you have a phone?

DETECTIVE CURCIO: How long have you had 1 2 the phone? How long have you had the phone? 3 Nick, the doctor's already looked at you. NIKOLAS CRUZ: Okay. 4 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. You're fine. 5 You're not having any problems at the moment and 6 you're perfectly fine. So calm your breathing 7 down. All right? And I want to believe certain 8 things that you're going to tell me but, you 9 know, if we're getting to where you're going to 10 11 hyperventilate over a phone number. Okay? All right? 12 NIKOLAS CRUZ: All right. 13 DETECTIVE CURCIO: So what's your phone 14 15 number? Huh? NIKOLAS CRUZ: 954. 16 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. 954. 17 18 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Uh, 821. DETECTIVE CURCIO: 821. Calm down. 19 Take 20 a deep breath. 21 NIKOLAS CRUZ: 107. 22 DETECTIVE CURCIO: 107? 23 NIKOLAS CRUZ: 107. 24 DETECTIVE CURCIO: What is it? 25 NIKOLAS CRUZ: 107.

1	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. There's one
2	more
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Two zero, zero, two zero
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. 954-821
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: 2007.
6	DETECTIVE CURCIO: 200
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No. One. 1007.
8	DETECTIVE CURCIO: 1007. Okay. And
9	again, going back to what kind it is. Do you
10	know if it's an iPhone, a Samsung?

12	DETECTIVE CURCIO: How long have you had
13	it? Every kid knows what the phone is, man.

7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Parkland. Okay. Do
8	you remember the address?

11	with you in Parkland with your mom back in

13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: My brother.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What's your brother's
15	name?

17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Zack? Same last name
18	as you?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What's his middle name?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I can't I don't know.
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: How about
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I think Roger.

19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: So he's 18? Do you
20	remember his date of birth? When's his
21	birthday?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: This year. This month.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. So February?
24	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
25	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Do you remember

1	what day?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. What was your
4	mom's name?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Lynda.
6	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Lynda? Cruz?
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: 2005? Okay.

NIKOLAS CRUZ: I think 2004, 2005.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. When he passed, what did he pass from?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Heart attack I think.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Heart attack. Okay.

Look, again, you have to understand we're going to talk about some things here and I know what happened today is hard. I understand what happened to your parents is hard. But the only way for you to make me understand is for you to be able to talk to me and tell me about this. Okay?

All right. Because, you know, I can talk to all the people in the world and I can watch all the videos in the world, but I only can talk to you to hear from you what was going on with you. Okay?

All right. Now I'm going back to Brother. I know you don't want to get him involved in anything. I'm not trying to get him involved in anything. Do you know what city he lives in or not? I just want to see, you know, before me and you really start talking that you understand what, what we're talking about.

1	I mean, what city did he live in?
2	Tamarac? Coral Springs? Parkland? If you
3	don't want to give his name to protect him, I
4	already know his name but that's fine. I
5	understand that. I understand people want to
6	protect friends sometimes. But what city did he
7	live in?
8	Okay. All right. All right. Why don't
9	you have a sip of water? You don't want it?
10	Okay.
11	, NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
12	negative).
13	DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. Let's talk
14	about your background. You went to Douglas.
15	How far did you go in school? What grade did
16	you graduate? Huh?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I started four years ago in
18	there.
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Well, what grade
20	did you get to? Tenth? Eleventh?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Tenth or 11th.
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. You didn't
23	graduate though, right?
24	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
25	DETECTIVE CURCIO: When was the last time

1	you attended either school at Douglas or
2	anywhere else?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I went to a lot of schools.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. When was the
5	last time you went to school? Did you go to
6	school at all this week?
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
8	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. When was the
9	last time you went to school? This year?
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, no. I went this week.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Where did you go
12	to school at? What school?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't think it's a
1 4	school.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. What is it?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Alternative school.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. What's it
18	called?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't know.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. What city is it
21	in?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Oakland I think.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Oakland Park?
2 4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Oakland.
2.5	DETECTIVE CURCIO. On Oakland Dark

1	Boulevard or Oakland Park?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I think in Oakland.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. All right. So
4	the last grade you went to Douglas you think was
5	tenth or eleventh. When was that, this year or
6	last year?
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Three years ago.
8	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Three years ago? Okay.
9	Were you a good student when you were there?
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I say somewhat.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Well, what kind of
12	grades did you get?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: B's and C's.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: That's not bad. B's
15	and C's are good. All right. They said you
16	were in the ROTC, too. Was is that factual
17	or is that just somebody telling a story? Were
18	you in the ROTC?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. How long were
21	you in the ROTC?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Two years.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Two years? Okay. All
24	right. Now, again, I never met you before. You
25 .	never met me before. I don't know anything

1	about drug use. You do any kind are you on
2	any kind of prescription medication?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No? Have you been to a
5	doctor for anything recently other than today at
6	the emergency room?
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
8	negative.)
9	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No?
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Just a finger broke.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You broke your finger?
12	When was that?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Huh?
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: When was that? When
15	did you break your finger?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Four to five weeks ago.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Four to five weeks ago?
18	All right. But you went to a doctor for that?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. You're not on
21	any pain killers now or anything like that?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. When your mom
24	passed away you weren't they didn't put you
25	on any kind of depressants or anything like

1	that?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
3	negative.)
. 4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No? Have you ever seen
5	a doctor about any kind of depression or
6	anything?
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
8	negative.)
9	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No? Okay. How
10	about you know, and again, I'm not I'm not
11	the drug police but I got to ask you. You do
12	any kind of street drugs? You smoke marijuana,
13	anything like that? If you did, it's okay to
14	tell me. I'm not the street I'm just getting
15	background on you. Did you do any kind of
16	drugs?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
18	affirmative.)
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What kind of drugs did
20	you do?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: A lot. No one knew about
22	it.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Huh?
24	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No one knew about it.
25	DETECTIVE CURCIO: I can't hear you.

1	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No one knew about it.
2	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No one knew about it.
3	But me and you are talking and you're the only
4	one who knew about it. So what kind of drugs
5	are we talking?
6	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Xanax.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Xanax.
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Marijuana.
9	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Marijuana. What else?
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Tried killing myself with
11	Ibuprofen and
12	DETECTIVE CURCIO: When was that? When
13	did you try killing yourself?
14	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Two months ago.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Did you actually
16	go to the doctor or where was that at? How did
17	you do it?
18	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I snuck out of the house.
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay.
20	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Went to Walgreens.
21	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. You were still
22	staying at Brother's house then?
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. You snuck out of
25	the house. You went to Walgreens. What

1	happened?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Bought Ibuprofen, Advil.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay.
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Went back. Took it. Drank
5	a lot of water. Went to bed.

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I got to do before we start talking about what happened today and, again, the reasons why it happened, I got to read you what's called your rights. With all these contacts you've had with the police, which are very, very minor, have you ever had your rights read to you before?

DETECTIVE CURCIO: No? Okay. They're really easy. I'm going to pull out a little card from my wallet and what I do is as I read these, I stop at each one and ask you --

NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't deserve it.

peterive curcio: I understand you're going to feel that way and you can tell me all that once we get passed that. But when I read each one of these to you, what I ask for you is a yes, no, or I don't understand answer. If you don't understand what I read to you, then we'll re-read it so you can understand it. But I can tell you're smart enough to understand, you know, these are pretty basic things.

All right. So the first one is: Before I ask you any questions I want to advise you of your rights under the law. Do you understand that I'm a police officer?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes. 1 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Yes. All right. I'm a 2 police officer. I showed you my badge. Okay. 3 You have the right to remain silent; that 4 is, you need not talk to me or answer any 5 questions if you do not want to. Do you 6 understand? 7 8 NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the 9 negative.) 10 DETECTIVE CURCIO: You don't understand 11 that? 12 NIKOLAS CRUZ: No. 13 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. I'm going to read it again. You have the right to remain 14 15 silent; that is, you need not talk to me or answer any questions if you do not want to. Do 16 17 you understand? 18 That means as I get done doing all these, if I ask you a question and you don't want to 19 answer that question, you don't have to answer 20 it. I'm not going to force you to answer any 21 questions. So do you understand that one? 22 23 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Not quite. DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. You have 24 25 the right to remain silent. That means you

don't have to talk to me at all. That is, you 1 2 need not talk to me or answer any questions if 3 you do not want to. Basically if you don't want to talk to me, you say you don't want to talk to 4 me and I can't force you to talk to me. 5 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Okay. 6 DETECTIVE CURCIO: So do you understand 7 that? 8 NIKOLAS CRUZ: I quess. DETECTIVE CURCIO: You can't guess. It's 10 yes, no, or I don't understand, but we're going 11 to read it one more time. You have the right to 12 remain silent; that is, you need not talk to me 13 or answer any questions if you do not want to. 14 15 Do you understand? That means if you answer a question, it's 16 because you want to answer it, not because I 17 want you to answer it. It's because you want to 18 answer it. Do you understand that? NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. So let, let me just rephrase that for you. If you say something good, I'm going to repeat it. If you say something bad, I'm going to repeat it. I'm going to tell the truth as to what our conversation is.

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Okay.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: So whatever you say I'm going to repeat and it could be in a court of law. Okay. So you understand that one? Yes?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. You have

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the right to talk to an attorney before talking to me and to have an attorney here with you during questioning now or in the future. Do you understand that?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. If you cannot afford to retain your own attorney and you want an attorney, one will be appointed for you before we ask you any questions. Do you understand?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: If you decide to answer the questions now without an attorney present, you'll still have the right to stop answering at any time until you talk to an attorney. Do you understand that?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. All right. Now, those are your rights. Knowing and understanding your rights as I've explained them to you, are you willing to continue talking to me without an attorney present? I'm gonna -- you gotta say. You can't just shake your head.

NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Now, you met a

1	lot of police officers before me and I'm
2	the only the last one, like I told you. Have
3	any other policemen read you what I just read
4	you?

So I -- you know, when you say, "I can't remember," for you not to believe you deserve it, you remember. You know what I'm saying?



13	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But have you
14	ever burned, killed, or destroyed anything?
15	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
16	affirmative.)
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What have you burned,
18	killed, or destroyed?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Burned just fires, set
20	fire.

2	only friend. That's kind of what you're saying.
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
4	affirmative.)
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Even though you have a
6	biological brother. Do you get along with
7	anybody at work?
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No. I try to get along
9	with everyone.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you ever go out
11	after work with people, you know, drinking or go
12	to, you know
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Always by myself.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Yeah? When you go
15	fishing do you ever go by yourself?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: And the demon.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Do you go
18	fishing by yourself?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you ever go fishing
21	with anybody else?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No? Well, like I said,
24	this, this post that's talking about being a
25	school shooter you remember the Mayerick

1	shotgun, right? Do you remember earlier when me
2	and you were talking and I asked you if you had
3	any other guns and you said no?
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Did I say no?
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Well, you said B.B.
6	gun. 'You didn't mention the Maverick shotgun.
7	That I would remember.
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, I do I said I have a
9	lot.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Huh?
11	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I do.
12	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You do remember saying
13	that?
14	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah, I believe. Did I?
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No, you never told me
16	about the Maverick shotgun. I'm trying to
17	figure
18	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, I told you I had other
19	guns, right?
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Well, you never told me
21	about a Maverick shotgun is what I'm trying to
22	get at.
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Okay. Yeah, I have I
24	have
25	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What other guns do you

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1	have?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Hi-Point.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: A Hi-Point. What
4	caliber?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: .9.
6	DETECTIVE CURCIO: When did you buy that?
7	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Uh, fuck. Umm
8	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Before or after the
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Before my mother died.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. And did you buy
11	that legitimately at a gun store or did you buy
12	it on the street?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Bought everything at a gun
14	shop.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Same gun shop?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No. Different ones.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay.
18	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I just can't remember.
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. The Hi-Point .9
20	millimeter. What else you own? What other kind
21	of gun?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Three shotguns.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Three shotguns?
24	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah, I had three shotguns.
2.5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okav. So the Maverick.

1	What other kind of shotgun?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Remington.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Remington. What gauge?
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Same.
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Twelve?
6	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Twelve.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: And what other ones?
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Mossberg.
9	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Mossberg, what gauge?
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Twelve.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Twelve. And what else?
12	Three shotguns, the AR-15, the .9 millimeter
13	Hi-Point. What else?
14	NIKOLAS CRUZ: AK.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: An AK-47?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. When did you buy
18	that?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Recently.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What does that mean?
21	Days or weeks or months?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Months.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Months. All
24	legitimately bought under your name?
2.5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.

1	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Nobody bought them for
2	you, right?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Was anybody there with
5	you when you bought them?
6	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Brother wasn't there?
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
9	negative.)
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Because you know we're
11	going to do follow-up on it. I'm just asking
12	you. Was anybody there with you or not?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: My mother was with me when
14	I bought all the other guns.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: All the other guns but
16	what?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: But the Moss what was
18	it? The what was it? The Maverick.
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. The Maverick.
20	So your mom was with you when you bought all of
21	the other guns?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Did you
24	NIKOLAS CRUZ: She wouldn't come in with
25	me

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Did you tell her why 1 you were buying the guns? I mean, look, I got 2 kids too. I'm taking my kid to the gun store to 3 buy all these weapons, I think I would ask them, 4 hey, Nick, why do you need all of them? Did you 5 ever have that conversation with your mom? 6 NIKOLAS CRUZ: I told her. 7 DETECTIVE CURCIO: You told her what? 8 NIKOLAS CRUZ: It was cool and to protect 10 myself. DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Protecting 11 12 yourself from what? NIKOLAS CRUZ: From the voice. 13 DETECTIVE CURCIO: To protect yourself you 14 needed three shotguns, two rifles, and a 15 handgun. How many other handguns other than the 16 Hi-Point? 17 NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't have any handguns. 18 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Isn't the Hi-Point --19 is the .9 millimeter is a handgun? It's a 20 21 rifle? NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah. They make rifles. 22 23 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Well, you know more about Hi-Points than I do. All right. So 24 you needed all those guns to protect yourself 25

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1	from the voices. But the voices in your head,
2	how are you going to get the voices out of your
3	head with three shotguns, two rifles three
4	rifles?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: To keep him occupied so he
6	doesn't do anything.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Did you have ammunition
8	for all these guns?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: How much money do you
11	think you spent over all these years on all
12	these guns and ammunition, about?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: 4,000.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: 4,000? When did you
15	buy your first gun? How old were you?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Eighteen.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: So was it just right
18	after you turned 18, like on your birthday?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
20	affirmative.)
21	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Which one did you buy
22	first?
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Remington.
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Twelve gauge? And you
25	never took any of these guns to the range and

1	practiced with them?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
3	negative.)
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Other than the AR, did
5	you ever shoot the AK?
6	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: How many magazines you
8	got for the AK?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Four.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Four. You got
11	ammunition for all four?
12	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
13	affirmative.)
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: And they're all at
15	Brother's house?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Where do you keep them?
18	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Safe.
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Safe? Is there a
20	combination to the safe?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: It's unlocked?
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: It's a key.
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Where's the key?
25	NIKOLAS CRUZ: In my drawer.

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1	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Is your drawer at the
2	house?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: The drawer to what?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: The safe.
6	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But the key to
7	get in the safe is in the drawer in the safe?
8	Where is the key to open the safe?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Uh, shelf thing.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Shelf thing of what,
11	like a desk?
12	NIKOLAS CRUZ: The the a dresser.
13	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Is it the only
14	key on a ring or is there other keys?
15	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Just that one.
16	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay.
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah, just that one.
18	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you keep the gun
19	safe locked all the time?
20	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
21	affirmative.)
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Why do you do that?
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: To protect myself.
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Protect yourself from
25	what?

1	NIKOLAS CRUZ: From my voice.
2	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. So you keep it
3	locked to keep the voice from getting into the
4	guns?
5	
6	
7	
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15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you since me and
16	you have been talking have you heard the voices?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
18	affirmative.)
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What's it said?
20	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Saying cut yourself.
21	DETECTIVE CURCIO: For you to cut
22	yourself? Does the voice like me?
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Huh?
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Does the voice like me?
25	NIKOLAS CRUZ: It doesn't trust you.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Why doesn't he trust 1 I'm pretty relaxed, ain't I? 2 me? NIKOLAS CRUZ: I'm trying -- I'm trying to 3 4 figure that out, too. DETECTIVE CURCIO: Well, what doesn't he 5 like about me? I mean, I'm kind of grinning 6 because I want to know what the voice's problem 7 is with me. What doesn't he like about me? 8 I've treated you fairly. I've given you water. 9 10 I've talked nice to you, you know. NIKOLAS CRUZ: You're too nice. 11 DETECTIVE CURCIO: I'm too nice. Yeah. 12 How many times has the voice talked to you while 13 we've been in the room here together? 14 NIKOLAS CRUZ: A lot. 15 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Has the voice said jump 16 17 out of the chair and do anything bad to that 18 policeman? NIKOLAS CRUZ: Saying kill yourself now. 19 20 DETECTIVE CURCIO: 21 22 23 Because I don't really believe 24 there is a voice to be honest with you. NIKOLAS CRUZ: There is a voice. 25

DETECTIVE CURCIO: No, I don't think there 1 2 is. NIKOLAS CRUZ: I'm telling you the truth. 3 There is. 4 DETECTIVE CURCIO: No. I mean, I feel you 5 probably want to kill yourself because of what 6 7 happened but --NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, the voice is telling me 8 to kill myself. 9 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But the voice is 10 telling you that the AR-15's his -- you like 11 guns, man. You wanted to be a ranger. You like 12 guns. It's all right. There's cops like that. 13 There's cops who got 15 million guns. You 14 didn't buy guns because the voice said, hey, 15 today I like Mossbergs. Tomorrow I like AR-15s. 16 17 You like quns. NIKOLAS CRUZ: Can you -- can you call the 18 19 psychologist? DETECTIVE CURCIO: I got -- I've already 20 got the questions from some of the 21 psychologists. Some of the questions I asked 22 you were from --23 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Is it? 24 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Yeah. 25

1	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Can I see?
2	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Those ones I asked you.
3	Look. Voices, are they inside or outside your
4	head? What do the voices say? These are all
5	questions I asked you. How many voices? You
6	said one. Whose voice do you think it was? You
7	didn't know.
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: What the fuck is wrong with
9	me?
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: I don't know. I don't
11	understand why you can't admit you like guns.
12	There's lots of guys who like
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, it's the voice. Oh,
1 4	fuck. Fuck.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You never kept any kind
16	of diary though, right, with these voices?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No diary.
18	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Why didn't you why
19	didn't you ever tell anybody other than your
20	brother about the voices trying to get help?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I was afraid.
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Huh?
23	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I was afraid.
2 4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Afraid of what? The
25	voice is telling you to kill yourself? What

1	what more can you be airaid of? I'd be like,
2	maybe I need to go to you want to talk to a
3	psychologist? Why didn't you talk to a
4	psychologist when the voices started?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: The voices told me not to
6	and I listened.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: The voice was telling
8	you not to talk to a psychologist?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah. But myself, I wanted
10	to.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Why didn't you slip a
12	note to somebody like your mom saying, mom, I
13	really need to go see a psychologist because I
14	got problems with hearing voices? Did you love
15	your mom?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
17	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Even though she
18	wasn't
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes, I loved my mom.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: So why wouldn't you
21	tell that to your mom?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Because I didn't want to
23	scare her.
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Yeah?
25	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I do love my mom.

1	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Yeah? We're gonna
2	we're gonna when did she pass away?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: November.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Pneumonia you said?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
6	affirmative.)
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Was she sick long?
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
9	affirmative.)
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: She was in the
11	hospital?
12	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I tried taking her to
13	the I told her to go see a doctor. I gave
14	her medicine.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What kind of medicine
16	did you try to give her?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Cough medicine.
18	DETECTIVE CURCIO: She died in the house?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, she the doctor told
20	me that she drove to the Minute Clinic and they
21	took her in and they took her to the hospital.
22	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. And where was
23	where was the clinic at? What city? Near your
24	house?
25	NIKOLAS CRUZ: It was CVS, CVS Minute

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1	Clinic.
2	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Close to where you're
3	staying at in Parkland?
4	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yes.
5	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. So she passed
6	away in the clinic or she passed away at the
7	hospital?
8	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Passed away at the
9	hospital. They took her to the hospital.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you remember which
11	hospital?
12	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Boca.
13	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Boca?
14	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I'm not sure.
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Were you were
16	you there when she passed away or
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
18	affirmative.)
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: So she was in the
20	hospital like in a room for a couple days?
21	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
22	affirmative.)
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You get a chance to
24	talk to her?
25	NIKOIAS CRIIZ. NO

1	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Was she in like a coma
2	or what was she?
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: It's like she talked to me.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But she was able
5	to communicate?
6	NIKOLAS CRUZ: She was able to communicate
7	but I didn't know what to think.
8	DETECTIVE CURCIO: But it was pneumonia
9	she died of?
10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Pneumonia.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: And even when she was
12	dying you didn't tell her about the voices?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
14	negative.)
15	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you ever go to
16	church?
17	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I wanted to.
18	DETECTIVE CURCIO: No, I'm saying ever in
19	your life.
20	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Yeah.
21	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you believe in God?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't believe in God.
23	I
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What do you believe in?
25	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I feel like there's

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something.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But if you believe in demons, do you believe in angels?

Angels is the good. Demons are the bad. When you say the word demon, do you think it's an evil spirit or what do you think it is?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: A voice, demon voice.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But going back, do you believe that there's good angels and God and afterlife and -- when your mom passed away that your mom is somewhere right now?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: I feel like there's an afterlife.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. So do you believe that your mom is somewhere, even though she's passed away she's somewhere else?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the affirmative.)

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But you never went to church or anything like that?

NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.

DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you ever just, you know, maybe think about when you were hearing the voices going to see a preacher or a priest or something like that?

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NIKOLAS CRUZ: Just one day where I was riding my bike and the voice told me not to go 2 anywhere, just to ride. 3 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Uh-huh. 4 5 NIKOLAS CRUZ: I stopped by the church. That was me. I wanted to stop by at the church. 6 7 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. NIKOLAS CRUZ: Just to sit there. 8 DETECTIVE CURCIO: So what did you think 9 10 you really had to do other than kill yourself to get the voice out of your head? You didn't 11 think a priest or a church could help you? What 12 13 did you think you had to do? NIKOLAS CRUZ: Try to kill myself. 14 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. Well, above and 15 beyond all that, was there something else you 16 could do to get that voice out of your head? 17 18 NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't know. 19 DETECTIVE CURCIO: I'm just asking. Did you pray? You ever ask God to get the voice out 20 21 of your head? 22 NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the 23 negative.) DETECTIVE CURCIO: Why not? You don't 24 25 believe in God? You believe there's something,

right? NIKOLAS CRUZ: I don't believe there's a God. I believe there's something. DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But the voice just doesn't like me because he thinks I'm too nice? NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the affirmative.) DETECTIVE CURCIO: Why do you think I'm nice? Why do you -- why do you think I'm nice? Forget the voice. Why do you think I'm nice? I already told you why. But why do you think I'm nice? What, what purpose would it be for me not to be nice?

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10	NIKOLAS CRUZ: To listen to music.
11	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What kind of music were
12	you listening to?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Sad music.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Did you have headphones
15	on?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
17	affirmative.)
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23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What what I mean,
24	I'm sure we don't like the same music. What
2.5	kind of music were you listening to? Name

1	the name the group.
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Muck what was it? Mark,
3	Mark Drain. Muck Drain.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: You have to help me.
5	Mark what?
6	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Mark something.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: What was the song
8	though?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Sad.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: That's the name of the
11	song, sad?
12	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No. Uh, Salad Days.
13	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Salad Days? And was
14	it you know, it was on your phone so it's on,
15	what, your I don't know anything about
16	phones. I don't listen to music on my phones,
17	man. It's on your I mean
18	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Uh, SoundCloud.
19	DETECTIVE CURCIO: SoundCloud? Is that
20	something like Pandora? I don't even know if
21	anybody uses Pandora any more. That's the only
22	thing I know. So it's on SoundCloud?
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1 2 DETECTIVE CURCIO: And what, what are the 3 lyrics to that? I mean, you don't have to sing 4 it for me, please. But what are the lyrics 5 about? 6 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Go home. 7 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Huh? 8 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Go home. 9 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Go home? 10 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Go home -- sucked -- just 11 it's all mixed together. 12 13 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. You had the big headphones on or 4 you had the little ear piece in? 5 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Little ear piece. 6 DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. What other song 7 other than the Russian? 8 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Just a lot of sad songs. 9 DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. Did you 10 pick the music yourself or did the demon pick 11 the music? 12 NIKOLAS CRUZ: Demon. And then myself 13 14 partially. DETECTIVE CURCIO: All right. Which ones 15 16 did you pick? 22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: (Nods head in the
23	affirmative.)
24	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Did you ever do
2.5	anything like that to try to find out under that

1	ancestry.com or anything?
2	NIKOLAS CRUZ: My mom tried to.
3	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. So you tried to
4	find your birth parents?
5	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No, not my birth parents.
6	My ancestry.
7	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. But you never
8	tried to find your birth parents?
9	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I wanted to.
10	DETECTIVE CURCIO: But did you ever try to
11	find them? I mean, you wanted to, but I'm
12	saying did you ever actually try to do anything?
13	NIKOLAS CRUZ: No.
14	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Do you know what city
15	you were born at all?
16	NIKOLAS CRUZ: I said fuck. I don't

23	what what size bar? How big a I mean,
24	what color was it?
25	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Half. Sometimes full.

1	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Okay. What color?
2	They all
3	NIKOLAS CRUZ: White.
4	DETECTIVE CURCIO: White? All right. But
5	that was off the street? Did they help you
6	sleep?

18	when you fell off the porch?
19	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Running.
20	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Running? Why were you
21	running?
22	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Because I was happy.
23	DETECTIVE CURCIO: Whose porch?
24	NIKOLAS CRUZ: Brother.

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


