RR,

I have recently been made aware of the "Marjorie Stoneman Douglas Tragedy Timeline" publicly posted by April Schentrup on their website and social media. You can view it on the following link:

The Cabinet has voiced concerns to you over Ms. Schentrup's behavior regarding her continued attacks on individual colleagues and the District relative to the tragedy at Marjorie Stoneman Douglas. As the Cabinet also said, her actions are even more concerning now that she is in a task assignment reporting directly to you.

I now have a personal concern over the misinformation, accusations, and misrepresentations made by April relative to me specifically. Look at the entire timeline and specifically at the section dated June 26, 2018. She inappropriately ties me into the narrative indicating that I should be disciplined and implies that I should not have my job because Andrew Medina was not terminated back in the fall of October, 2017... months before the tragedy occurred on 2/14/2018.

Medina's suspension instead of termination was an action decided upon by a group of individuals in the Post PSC Review. The group decided it was appropriate to suspend rather than terminate him based on what evidence (and lack of evidence) was presented in the case along with the official personnel record of Medina showing him to be a good employee during his several years of employment with the District. Again, it was a decision made several months before February, 2018. It is wrong to tie Medina's suspension together with the events of 2/14/2018 and especially to individually associate me into the MSD tragedy timeline.

It's not only wrong but also creates a safety and security concern for both me and my family. Publicly posting such misinformation and accusations on social media opens the potential to mislead someone who might want to do physical harm or property damage to those who are falsely accused of somehow having helped to cause the tragedy.

Additionally, implying that I deserve discipline or even that I shouldn't be in my job personally attacks my dedication and integrity. Plus, it certainly does not instill a sense of job security. This is not a frivolous concern. To prove my point I need only to reference the last minute non-reappointment of campus monitors Taylor and Medina after public pressure mounted against them.

I don't need to continue pointing out the obvious to you. Read for yourself the timeline and consider all the other events you know are going on with April.

I and others do not deserve this and it can't be tolerated. You, Barbara Myrick, and I need to meet immediately to discuss how the situation with April will be addressed in an affirmative and effective manner. I will follow up with Theresa Silva and Joanne Fritz to arrange a meeting this week.
